

Choosing the right privacy screen starts with accurate measurements. Let's look at the five crucial steps to ensure a precision fit when measuring your screen for a privacy filter.

Step 1: Check your Display Settings:

Windows: Go to Settings > System > Display. Find the resolution (e.g., 1920 x 1080).

Mac: Go to Apple Menu > System Settings > Displays. The resolution will be shown there.

Step 2: Calculate the Aspect Ratio:

Privacy screens come in different shapes and sizes to fit various screens. To ensure your privacy screen covers your screen properly and looks clear, you need to match the aspect ratio.

Divide the width by the height from the resolution (e.g., 1920 ÷ 1080 = 1.78, which is 16:9). Common aspect ratios are 16:9, 16:10, and 4:3

Step 3: Measure Diagonal

Measure the diagonal length of your screen accurately, **excluding the bezels**. This diagonal measurement is the critical reference point for selecting the appropriate privacy screen size.

Measure the diagonal of your screen to match the privacy filter size (e.g., 13-inch, 15-inch).

Match Aspect Ratio and Screen Size: Choose a privacy filter that fits both the aspect ratio (e.g., 16:9) and the screen size (e.g., 15 inches).

Step 4: Validate Measurements Before Purchase: Before you buy, double-check your measurements to make sure they match the privacy screen's specifications. Manufacturers usually provide sizing guides, and some privacy screens can adjust to fit different screen sizes. Compare your measurements with these guides to avoid getting a screen that's too small or too big for your device.

Best fit tip: Choose a filter that's slightly smaller but closest to your measurements. If you're buying a Framed Privacy Filter, pick one that's slightly larger but closest to your measurements.

Step 5: Choose the Type of Privacy Screen: Decide whether you want an adhesive, clip-on, or magnetic privacy screen. Each type has its own benefits depending on your needs and how easy you want it to be to use, install, and remove.
